



## Chickasaw Trash

**What is trash?** Trash is tree limbs, yard debris, furniture, and bedding.

- Any grass clippings, leaves, pine straw, or similar debris should be bagged.
- Trash should be placed neatly in a pile not to exceed three (3) cubic yards
- Contractor debris or any trash or debris created because of a contractor is the contractor's responsibility. If a resident goes to a contractor to do any work, it is the contractor's responsibility to collect and remove any debris.

**Where to place trash?** Trash should be placed curbside away from obstructions such as vehicles, street signs, fire hydrants, and low-hanging power lines. Failure to properly place trash piles may result in trash not being collected. Trash should be placed on main streets and not on alleyways.

**Excluded items:** The following items will not be accepted.

- Any liquids, including paint, spackle, used cooking oil, etc.
- Microwaves, refrigerators, and freezers
- Limbs greater than 12 inches in diameter or greater than 8 feet in length
- Evictions, cleanouts
- Any materials from commercial businesses will not be collected as part of household trash
- Contractor Debris
- Unbagged leaves, pine straw, or any other small debris
- Hazardous waste
- Household garbage

**When will trash be picked up?** Trash will be collected every other week. Collection days will be Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday, starting January 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2025. Holidays are as follows:

New Year's Day	Independence Day
Labor Day	Thanksgiving Day
Memorial Day	Christmas Day

If your scheduled pickup day falls on a holiday, your trash will be collected on the next scheduled pickup day. If the volume of trash exceeds what we can collect, it will be carried over to the next collection day. Example: Monday holiday trash will be collected the following Wednesday and Thursday. Wednesday holiday trash will be collected the following Thursday. If a holiday falls on a Thursday, the trash will be collected on the Monday and Wednesday BEFORE the holiday.
