*A RESOLUTION RE-APPOINTING LYNN BRISCOE TO
THE BOARD OF EDUCATION FOR THE CHICKASAW SCHOOL SYSTEM*

WHEREAS, the City Council for the City of Chickasaw, Alabama (the "City") has created a City Board of Education (BOE) pursuant to Alabama Code§ 16-11-1, et seq. (1975);

WHEREAS, the City Council has resolved to appoint five (5) residents of the City of Chickasaw, who are not members of the City Council, and who were chosen upon their character and fitness, to serve;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT BE RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Chickasaw, Alabama as follows:

- a. Lynn Briscoe is re-appointed to serve on the Chickasaw School Board of Education.
- b. The term of Lynn Briscoe shall commence upon expiration of the current term in April 2026 and shall continue until April 2031, or until a successor is duly appointed and qualified.

WHEREAS, the City of Chickasaw solicited bids for the FY25 Rebuild Alabama Act (RAA) Grant RRR Project, including Grant Street, Short Street, and Ryan Street; and

WHEREAS, the City did receive four (4) bids which were opened and read aloud on April 7, 2026, at 10:00 am; and

WHEREAS, the Project Engineer of Record at Kimley-Horn did tabulate and certify the bids received and recommend awarding the contract for the said project to the lowest responsive responsible bidder, Arrington Curb & Excavation, Inc., in the amount of \$174,543.04; and

NOW, THEREFORE, IT BE RESOLVED that the City of Chickasaw, IN REGULAR SESSION, by this Resolution, awards the FY25 Rebuild Alabama Act to Arrington Curb & Excavation, Inc. in the amount of \$174,543.04

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute all documents necessary to effectuate the award and proceed with the project.
